## Sussex County Treasurers Report

## From 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020

The bank account has decreased by £2364 over the year from April, but the county remains well funded and can continue to support initiatives to enhance British Gymnastics in the county

More than 30 clubs affiliated to the county and were able to access the funding funds available for BG courses, which was taken up by a number of clubs.

Woman's artistic had a successful invitational competition at Horsham and used some of the proceeds to enter an invitation to a new inter-county competition held in Dorset as well as the Rushmore invitational where clubs from Europe also compete. This was in addition to the regular quarterly squad days.

The tumble and DMT championships were held separate to the artistic and trampoline championships and went well. An unforeseen impact was the reduction in numbers at both the gymnastic and trampoline championships, resulting in increased costs and an overall loss.

The trampoline championships were held at K2 and the impact was well worth the extra costs. Four county competitions were held at different club venues during the year as well, and profits were shared between the clubs and the county.

A mental health awareness day was held in October at K2 funded by the county
